Project Title: Torbay Green Team



PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Green Team will assist the Department of Public Works with the set up of a new green house at the existing community garden site. The team will maintain the gardens, assist residents with their plots and help to expand the garden. The team will educate residents about the uses and benefits of rain barrels to collect rain water, backyard composting and growing their own produce. They will conduct weekly “how-to” on-site and offsite seminars at the community garden and various locations in the town, develop and share recipes using homegrown food. In addition the team will host a season-end BBQ showcasing some of the gardens produce. Teams will also deliver a minimum of five Environmental Awareness Events.

POSITIONS

TEAM LEADER (1 Position): The Team Leader is the day to day supervisor for the Green Team. This person is responsible for the conduct of Team Members and the work they undertake. The Team Leader ensures that the work required is properly assigned and carried out, and that the project proceeds smoothly. This involves planning, maintaining discipline, daily acquisition of project materials, effective communication with the community partner and CCNL staff, administrative duties etc. A team leader should demonstrate the ability to plan and organize, and must have leadership and supervisory skills. **This position is for 8 weeks, at \$12.15/hr for 35 hours per week from July 3 to August 24, 2018.**

TEAM MEMBER (3 Positions): The Team Member is an integral part of the Green Team program. The Team Member follows the direction given by the Team Leader, has the ability to work well in a team environment and feels that s/he can make a positive contribution to the projects undertaken. **These positions are for 8 weeks, at \$11.15/hr for 35 hours per week from July 3 to August 24, 2018.**
