RESOLVED THAT Prior to any future development on individual groundwater wells and septic (housing development plans greater than 5 lots or any commercial or public facility requiring a non-domestic water supply well), applicants will need to provide the Town of Torbay with data regarding the demand requirements on groundwater resources, so that the Town can determine if additional data requirements are needed to fully evaluate the sustainability and feasibility of the proposed development. This information will be added to the Town of Torbay Groundwater Flow Model. This new requirement will not be required for developments that are already in the approval process.

- Clean and safe accessible water is a priority, and the Town is using available technology.
 - Groundwater resources has been the focus of the Town over the last couple of years. The Town has taken the lead in the Province and completed a groundwater flow model. Developers will be made aware of this model, and it will be added to and enhanced as further groundwork is completed.
 - As a Council, one of the main focus was the area of the Pineridge subdivision and the Jack Byrne Arena. Contamination from the airport did flow into our community and took South Pond from the Town as a water resource. Committee recommended a model test in the area and for the whole Town, which was completed. The groundwater flow model will grow and be supplement as further studies are completed.
 - Talks are still ongoing with the City of St. John's, and their water study should be available to the Town in the near future.

- Economic Development has now been rolled into Planning and Development. Reporting is still in discussions and more to come.

Items discussed included:

Corporate Services

1. Donation request from Home Again Furniture Bank
 - Committee discussed possibility of setting aside gently used items collected during Spring clean-up to provide to the group. The Director of Corporate and Community Services to follow up with Director of Public Works.
2. 2016 Federal Budget Submission
 - CAO noted this was discussed with staff on providing recommendations, with water and recreation infrastructure being the priority.
3. Major Town Projects (Mayor Tapper)
 - (a) Getting ready to go! Partnership updates (Govt. Funding Partners)
 - Mayor brought forward the need to look for funding for the wellness centre and Pine Ridge project. Mayor will be meeting with Councillors Thorne-Gosse and Roche to prepare a presentation this week.
 - (b) Jack Byrne Arena Engineering Study
 - There will be a meeting in March on an upcoming proposal for a second ice pad. There will be a feasibility study and a scope of work for engineering.
 - (c) Farm Property Taxation (Mayor Tapper)
 - Mayor Tapper received a letter from a resident who is the owner of farm land in the Town. Committee discussed process for taxing farm land and whether the approved farm land listing can be provided

- earlier in the tax year. CAO and the Director of Corporate and Community Services to follow up with resident to address concerns.
- (d) Donations (Mayor Tapper)
- Northeast Avalon Eagles Hockey
 - Portugal Cove-St. Philip's Community Challenge
 - Discussion over proposed donation to fundraiser. To be based on donations from other organizations.
- (e) Status of Museum Donation Transfer
- Mayor inquired on the status of the Museum. CAO advised that it is currently with the bank and she has contacted them for an update.
- (f) Grand Concourse
- Councillor Roche inquired on the Grand Concourse. Mayor gave briefing.
- (g) Conservation Lands (Mayor Tapper)
- Mayor discussed the large amount of land deemed to be conservation land in which the owner is unknown. This creates an issue when a party is looking to put a trail through the land and permission must be granted. Mayor suggested a letter to residents to see if any have conservation land and where it is located. CAO also mentioned discussions with lawyer regarding "owner unknowns" attached to properties.

Community Services:

1. Indirect/Direct Costs
 - The Director of Community Services and the Director of Corporate and Community Services presented costings for upcoming Summer programs. Further material regarding some programs will come forth at next Committee meeting for further discussion.
2. Plan B Kinsmen Centre –renovation and expansion
 - Committee was informed that the CAO has sent a letter requesting re-profiling with updates to follow once staff have received a response.
 - The Director updated Committee on the resident meeting that was held on January 26th, 2016. Present at the meeting was Councillor Thorne-Gosse, Councillor Scott, CAO, and Director of Community Services. Seven residents provided their thoughts and comments.
 - The Director and Economic Development Officer are in discussions of Corporate Sponsorship.

3. No Loitering Sign

- Committee discussed looking at the current signage at the Kinsmen Centre to ensure it is worded properly. CAO will review with Public Works.

4. Ultramar Funding and Grand Opening

- The Director noted to Committee that an application was submitted to Ultramar to seek funding for the upcoming Multi-Purpose Building at Upper Three Corner Pond Park. Director will report back if funding is approved.
- As well, the Director noted that an invitation for the new Ultramar was received for the grand opening on Friday, January 29th @ 3:00pm. Council Members did attend.

Councillor Thorne-Gosse provided an overview of items discussed under the Corporate and Community Services Committee Meeting Minutes, dated January 20, 2016.

6. Program updates were provided on the following;

- Babysitting Course, Cooking for Wellness, Eating Well for Less, Snowshoe Hikes, Young Hearts Fitness, Tea and Tour, Play My Way and the Soccer AGM.

Deputy Mayor Gallant discussed this year's Summer Camp, questioning capacity and programs for children with special needs and accessibility issues. He requested that the Town ensure we are as accommodating as possible. He requested that this matter be added to Committee's agenda for the next meeting, indicating there are resources we can avail of.

Councillor Smith questioned the Ultramar Funding and Grand Opening and the Town's application for funding. Mayor Tapper advised that if the Town is successful in funding approval, it will go towards upgrading or new equipment for the multi-purpose building at Upper Three Corner Pond Park.

Councillor Smith discussed Government Funding and major Town projects. She discussed that there is significant funding coming from the Federal government, and the Town should be ready as this is a unique opportunity for the Province and the Town. A call will come within the next month and the Province has a real opportunity to acquire funding. Mayor Tapper requested that staff look ahead at all projects and have applications ready for submissions.
